Birthday treats are not expected and due to the large number of allergies, we ask that if you choose to provide a special birthday treat please ensure that it is individually packaged for students to take them home rather than sharing at school. Regarding invitations, students quickly figure out what those little envelopes in their mailboxes mean and this has gotten to be quite an issue in the past. Therefore, birthday invitations are to be left in children's backpacks, rather than their mailboxes. Each month you will receive a calendar indicating which day you are invited to join our class as parent helper. If there is a specific day of the week or month that works best for you, please let me know ASAP and we will accommodate you. This is also your chance to witness the abilities and growth taking place in your child over the course of the year.

## Bedtime Stories Boost Brain Waves

When you snuggle with your child and read him/her stories, you stimulate many senses at once, making the experience pleasurable and creating positive associations with reading. Start with short reading sessions and increase their length as his/her attention span grows. When you point to words in the text with your finger as you read, you are helping to train your child's eyes to automatically follow words and symbols from left to right. Very soon we will begin our Story Take Home Program! Stay tuned for more information!

As strange as some of them may seem, they are very important. I will be keeping track of them as they come in. This is extremely important to hand back as it will allow a speech-language pathologist to screen children and give me much needed support on how best to help all of the students in our class. ## Kindergarten Skating is Coming Fast!

### WE WILL NEED VOLUNTEERS!

Kindergarten skating will take place on November 1, 8, 29, and December 6. On each of these days we will be taking a small trip to Nicholas Sheran arena to learn to skate together! I can't stress enough that we need as much help for these trips as possible **ESPECIALLY** if your child is not able to skate. Without their own parent helper, your child is not guaranteed 1 on 1 support for the entire time. I will be sending home a form soon and asking for it to be returned to me, letting me know which **SPECIAL PERSON** (mom, dad, friend, aunt, uncle etc.) is able to



help out and when.



**MORNING CLASS 9:30-10:30am (we hope to be on the ice at 9:30 am)**

**AFTERNOON CLASS 1:15-2:15pm (we hope to be on the ice at 1:15 pm)**

Siblings are welcome as long as they are fully supervised and **have SKATING helmets (NOT bicycle helmets)**.

Each child needs to bring their own pair of skates. **NO CHILD** (including siblings) **WILL BE ALLOWED ON THE ICE WITHOUT A PROPER SKATING (HOCKEY) HELMET.** If your child does not have a helmet, the school does own some that can be borrowed.

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
